A NOTE FROM DENISE SONNEMANN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

To most people, going up to a stranger at a Business After 5 and introducing yourself is a bit overwhelming. Unless you are a social butterfly, you can find it hard to force yourself to network. The thing is, networking is very beneficial for you and your business.

Professional networking is the building of mutual beneficial connections with other business professionals. There are several benefits to networking, including improved self confidence and creative intellect, but most people network to build their professional career. The difference between meeting new people and networking is the connection that will help both people speed up their career development. Networking helped 70% of people find their current job.

Gov. Tony Evers has signed <u>Assembly Bill 627</u> into law as <u>2023 WI Act 143</u>. This legislation modernizes the state's Business Development Tax Credit (BTC), changing it from a job-focused incentive to a capital expenditure-focused program.

Under previous law, BTC awards were based on job creation, which was extremely challenging amid a growing and likely long-term workforce shortage. One of the biggest challenges currently facing Wisconsin employers is their inability to find enough workers, and they are increasingly turning to automation and other substantial capital expenditures to bridge the labor gap. The new law will make the BTC program more flexible and competitive, by steering primary eligibility for tax awards away from job creation and instead emphasize capital investment.

In addition to eliminating the requirement that a business must increase net employment in the state year over year, the law will now offer BTC eligibility if a business makes a capital investment in the state and retains existing jobs. The recently signed legislation also creates additional BTC tax awards for businesses that invest in workforce housing and childcare for their employees. Lastly, the bill recognizes the importance of business decision timelines by requiring WEDC to approve or deny BTC awards within 90 days.

AMERICAN EXPRESS BACKING SMALL BUSINESS GRANT SUPPORTING UNDER-RESOURCED BUSINESSES; APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED UNTIL APRIL 7 OR UNTIL 5,000 APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

In partnership with American Express, the Backing Small Businesses grant program supports economically vulnerable and under-resourced small businesses with community reach. Eligible small business owners can apply for \$10,000 grants for projects that grow or improve their businesses by building community, supporting their economic viability, or bolstering meaningful change.

Applications will be accepted through 11:59 pm CT on April 7, 2024. The application period will end once 5,000 applications have been submitted, even if that occurs before the deadline.

Selected eligibility criteria (see link for full criteria)

The business must...

·be in a "brick-and-mortar" location and operate in an older or historic main street, downtown, or commercial district in the United States.

·Have occupied their current bricks-and-mortar location since January 1, 2024. Home-based businesses are not eligible.

·Be an independent business and not part of a franchise.

·Employ 20 or fewer full-time employees.

·Have been in operation on or before January 1, 2023.




