
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

FAMILIES ENCOURAGED TO PARTICIPATE IN DRUG TAKE BACK EVENT OCTOBER 29



On Saturday, October 29th, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and Wisconsin Department of Justice are sponsoring a prescription drug take back event throughout Wisconsin. Take back events provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of medications. Remember to never flush or drain unused/expired prescription medications. These substances can contaminate our water supply if not disposed of properly. Parents/guardians, grandparents, and other adults who spend time with youth are especially encouraged to participate in an effort to prevent prescriptions drugs from being taken and misused.

Local law enforcement, in collaboration with IMPACT Wood County and Marshfield Area Coalition for Youth (MACY), are participating in events on Saturday, October 29th at the following Wood County locations:

Marshfield City Hall (10am-2pm)

- · Nekoosa Piggly Wiggly (8 am-12pm)
- · Pick 'n Save Wisconsin Rapids Location (10am-2pm)
- · Pittsville Police Department (9am-12pm)
- · Port Edwards Fire Department (11am-1pm)
- · Town of Rome Police Department, Adams County (10am-2pm)

Bring: Capsules, creams, inhalers, non-aerosol sprays, ointments, pills, patches, vials, liquids (in original containers), pet medications, vape pens or other e-cigarette devices with batteries removed.

Do not bring: Aerosol cans, anything containing blood or a bodily fluid, household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas), illegal drugs, iodine containing medications, mercury thermometers, personal care products (shampoo, soaps, lotions, sunscreens, etc.), sharps* (i.e. syringes, lancets, needles are accepted only at the Marshfield event), or vape devices containing built-in batteries that cannot be removed.

*Sharps disposals located at Aspirus Riverview Hospital main entrance, Aspirus Doctor's Clinic 1st floor, Marshfield Medical Center emergency room entrance, and Marshfield Police Department main lobby. The Marshfield drug take back location will accept sharps.

Those who cannot attend a take back event can drop off unwanted medications at a Wood County law enforcement agency or at pharmacies with a disposal kiosk: CVS in Wisconsin Rapids, Marshfield Clinic Pharmacy (main clinic and Central Avenue), and Walgreens in Wisconsin Rapids. Remember to store any medications you are taking in a secure location.

If you are homebound or know of someone who needs safe at-home disposal options, or to request a lock box/drawer safe for securing medications, contact Jacob with the Wood County Health Department at 715-421-8907.

FALL ELECTION FAQ



How do I register to vote for the November 8, 2022 election?

- Register online at MyVote.WI.gov through Wednesday, October 19, 2022.
- Registration can be done in-person at City Hall during regular business hours until November 4, 2022.
 - You may also register on Election Day. Proof of residency is required.
 - There is no voter registration on the Monday prior to the election.
- Voters must be 18 years or older, a US citizen, and have resided at the address you provide on your registration form for at least 28 consecutive days immediately proceeding the election in order to vote.

How do I request an absentee ballot?

Contact the Marshfield City Clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you. You may make a written application to the Marshfield City Clerk for an absentee ballot by mail or at MyVote.wi.gov.

Your written request must include:

- Your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote
- The address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different from the address above
- The election(s) you wish to receive an absentee ballot for
- Your signature
- A copy of your <u>photo identification</u>
- The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is 5:00 p.m. on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, November 3, 2022.

How do I return my ballot?

- Absentee ballots may be returned via USPS or at the Marshfield City Hall front desk during regular business hours by the voter.
- Absentee ballots MUST be received by 8 p.m. on Election Day.

When is in-person absentee voting?

In-person voting takes place at Marshfield City Hall.

Tuesday, October 25, 2022 to October 27, 2022 from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Friday, October 28, 2022 from 7:30 a.m. to noon

Monday, October 31, 2022 to Thursday, November 3, 2022 from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Friday, November 4 at 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Saturday, November 5 at 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Please bring a photo ID. There is no absentee voting on the Monday prior to the election.

When are polls open on Election Day?

The polls are open at 7 a.m and close at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8, 2022. There are three locations in the City of Marshfield for voting on election day.

Oak Avenue Community Center, 201 S. Oak Avenue, Marshfield - Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 10 and City portion of Marathon County Second Street Community Center, 211 E. 2nd Street, Marshfield, Districts 8 and 9 Wildwood Station, 1800 S. Roddis Avenue, Marshfield, Districts 5, 6, and 7

Offices on the ballot for the November 8, 2022 General Election are posted on the Chamber website.

OCTOBER IS MANUFACTURING MONTH

Wisconsin Manufacturers & Commerce (WMC) – the combined state chamber and manufacturers' association – celebrates each October as Manufacturing Month and the first Friday of the month as Manufacturing Day.

Throughout October, WMC, its members and partners, and communities throughout the state will recognize the importance of manufacturing to Wisconsin's economy. Manufacturing contributes \$68 billion to the state's economy. As the state's largest industry, it employs one in six Wisconsin workers – the equivalent of nearly half a million jobs.

"Throughout October, we hope to educate young Wisconsinites about the rewarding careers available in manufacturing along with highlighting the outsized impact the industry has on our state."

In addition, WMC has partnered once again with Johnson Financial Group to host the seventh annual Coolest Thing Made in Wisconsin contest.

More than 100 Wisconsin-made products were nominated this year, and voters have narrowed down the field to a Top 16. Those products will compete in a bracket-style tournament called Manufacturing Madness until only four remain. A final popular vote will determine the winner, which will be announced at WMC's Business Day Event in Madison on October 19.

State Representative Donna Rozar also received the Building Wisconsin award from Associated Builders & Contractors of WI (ABC) for her efforts during the last legislative session to get more people into the skilled construction trades. The award was presented to Representative Rozar at Quality Roofing of Marshfield and MACCI's 2020 Firm of the Year.

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
